Advent Reflection: November 30th through December 24th

1. Reading: Hymn "Creator of the Stars of Night"

Creator of the stars of night, your people's everlasting light, O Christ, Redeemer of us all, we pray you hear us when we call.

2. Reflection: "Creator of the Stars of Night"

On the Salisbury Plain in southern England in the 7th century, the night was filled with stars and galaxies. An anonymous composer wrote the hymn "Creator of the Stars of Night". It is an ancient, haunting melody that expresses hope, longing, and desire. It is the church advent hymn where we hope for the Paraclete to join heaven and earth in one, in Jesus.

- b) speak to one another, without being overly personal or revealing privacy matters, about your hopes, longings, and yearnings for you and your family and our world
- c) what are your plans for this Christmas? how to prepare joy and peace in the midst of this isolation.
