I was blessed to be able to attend the memorial Mass offered by Monsignor Sam Bianco last Saturday; pleased to meet some of Anar's family and gratified to see so many staff, Board members and Vincentians in attendance. It was a lovely tribute to a woman of faith who will be missed by all.

Our seminars on home visitation continue to bear fruit and I encourage each of you to try to find time to attend the next series of sessions. In some ways it's like attending Mass – you discover that you're not alone! It's a great way to be reminded of best practices and perhaps to give each of us the confidence to engage our own Conferences in similar discussions.
