From the Chair...

Some of us have been called upon to deliver the annual appeal message for our Conference and all of us have listened, often with some trepidation, as the designated Vincentian does his or her best to convey to the parishioners the calling that we share and work that we do. Personally, I try focus on how thankful we are for our donor's generosity and let them know how grateful the vast majority of our neighbours in need are for whatever help we can provide. To lighten things up I sometimes try a joke and an oldie but goodie that I've used goes like this: there's good news and there's bad news. The good news is that we have all the money we need to meet our obligations. The bad news is that it's still in your pockets.

Well, I am pleased to say that the Greater Toronto Central Council has all the money it needs to do all the things it does for our 11 Particular Councils, 114 Conferences and 1400 Vincentians. The bad news is it's sitting in your bank accounts. While it's true that many of our outreach programs and residential settings are funded by grants and contracts with government agencies, not all of them enjoy that support. We certainly don't receive any grants or funding to pay for the staffing, equipment, insurance and resources we use daily to support our Conferences and Particular Councils. As Vincentians, we talk a lot about the need to find housing for persons in need, and our mission to advocate for these folks. Greater Toronto Central Council does just that and we do it on behalf of all our Vincentians, and could do even more, with more support.

The Board is extremely grateful to all the Conferences and Particular Councils who act responsibly and regularly pass up their fair share; we need all Conferences and Particular Councils to follow their example. Pardon my candour, but anyone regularly sitting on more than six months of operating expenses is hoarding, plain and simple. Our Society is not a top-down organization; at Central Council, we don't issue commands but rather are here to serve our Conferences and Particular Councils and individual Vincentians. We simply cannot provide those services without some financial help from those on whose behalf we labour. Just as Moses didn't come down from the mountain with 10 "suggestions", the Rule doesn't just "suggest" you pass up money not needed locally.

I believe each of you shares the pride and the sense of accomplishment we get from whatever outreach in which we are engaged. We are blessed with marvellous staff and generous donors and we want to be able to continue and grow in the work we do. We are all in this together and it's only by sharing what we have that we'll be able to succeed going forward. I ask each of you, in your Conferences and Particular Councils, to take a hard and honest look at what you really need to support your local outreach and think about all that Central Council does on your behalf; all the boring, behind the scenes efforts without which much of what we do would not be possible.

Our residents and our Neighbours in Need are counting on you; the Board and staff are counting on you. I am confident you won't let us down.

The Greater Toronto Central Council expanded its services beyond Home Visitation to providing much needed supportive and emergency housing to persons in need from all over the GTA. We also operate camps, stores and other programs and services. You will learn all about our outreach, and will understand how GTCC serves, and how much we all do; you, your Conferences, Particular Councils and Central Council, and our donors, for persons in need.

Membership Applications and Information

We have received many applications from new members, good news for the Conferences and for those whom we serve. Welcome! Questions have come forward regarding police checks. Please note, we cannot use the Archdiocesan screening services as they provide Criminal Reference Checks. The Society signed an undertaking with the Archdiocese that we would screen our own members. We have agreements in place with police departments to support Vulnerable Sector Checks as opposed to the Criminal Records Checks. This is due to the nature of our work, directly serving vulnerable persons.

The Vulnerable Sector check process may require an applicant to provide finger prints if they have a birthdate similar to that of a registered offender. While inconvenient, it is part of our duty of care to the persons we serve. Please inform perspective members that they should not provide a positive police check to the Conference President, individuals who have something on their record and who wish to continue the process of becoming a member should email the Executive Director, Louise Coutu to arrange a time to discuss the record. This process is in place to protect the privacy of the perspective member. If we are able to proceed with the membership, positive records are not kept on file. Please handle these situations with great concern for privacy.
